This is the most comprehensive exhibition of Anna Fox to date. It brings together over thirty years of work and builds from her 2008 retrospective at Impressions Gallery, curated by Anne McNeill.

Always engaged with the people around her, this exhibition takes the visitor on a journey from Fox's celebrated pictures of Work Stations from 1988, through her major bodies of work such as Back to the Village, Pictures of Linda and My Mothers Cupboard and My Fathers Words, and culminates in her remarkable large-scale pictures of the family and adult friendly worlds of a Butlins holiday camp, Resort I and Resort 2.

ABOUT US

ANNA FOX

Anna Fox emerged in the early 1980s as one of the most exciting colour documentarists at a time when photographic and cultural territories were being radically redrawn. Fox was enchanted by the 'ordinary', and helped to redefine documentary photography in Britain and Europe. Fox's work is represented in a number of major collections and has been exhibited internationally. She is a professor of photography at the University of Creative Arts (UCA) at Farnham, UK, and also leads the research project Fast Forward: Women in Photography.

THE HYMAN COLLECTION

The Hyman Collection is the private collection of Claire and James Hyman. The Hyman Collection supports photographers working in Britain and is one of the most significant collections of British Photography in the world.

The collection began in 1996 and consists of over three thousand artworks with a focus on photography in Britain. The collection ranges from conceptual artists working in photography to documentary photographers, and encompasses historic as well as contemporary photographs. The collection is committed to diversity and to supporting women in photography.

The Centre for British Photography has a loan agreement with the Hyman Collection and administers its loans programme.

CENTRE FOR BRITISH PHOTOGRAPHY

The Centre for British Photography (registered charity number 1190955) was founded by James Hyman in 2020 and seeks to support photographers working in Britain through exhibitions, events, grants and mentoring.

The charity provides a platform for a range of voices in order to present an expansive overview of the diversity of photography, past and present.




